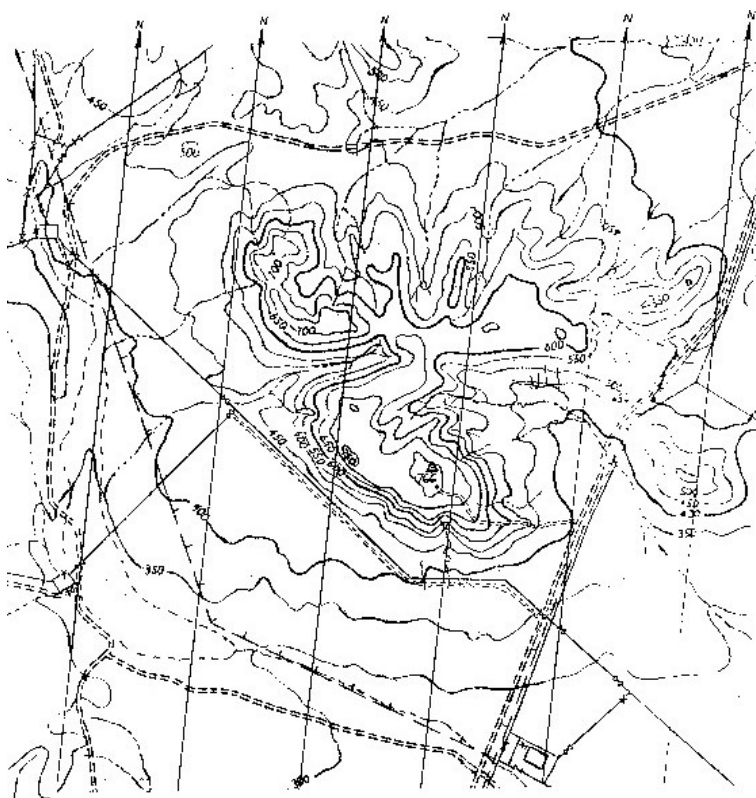


SALTBUSH MEMORIES FROM 1978

extend season

The South Coast Orienteering Club has extended its season this year because of increased public interest, and will be holding two more events.

The next event will be score orienteering which differs from the more usual course of which participants visit a number of control points in a set order.

The checkpoints in score orienteering are given points values dependent on their distance and degree of difficulty. The objective is to collect as many points in a set time, and points are deducted for exceeding that time.

This event will start at the gymnasium near the banks north-east of Nurra avenue bypass on Saturday between 1.00 and 2.00 pm.

Orienteers find State placings

Six of Wyallda's southern orienteers took part in the 1978 South Australian score orienteering championships at Mount Gawler, near Kepplebrook, on Sunday.

Charles Clark was the second South Australian to finish the 19th section with his overall sixth place.

Murray Young finished seventh in the M35 section of the third (unmultiple) race course from SA, and John Clark took 12th place in the M18 section.

The Mount Gawler area proved a challenge for the participants with its wild forest terrain.

Orienteers run in wet conditions

A successful meeting was held by the Kaitumaah Orienteers despite the wet and windy conditions.

The course consisted of 14 controls for a points value of 400 points. The time limit for the course was 1 hour 30 minutes.

The open section was won by Bob Lincoln's Peter Vagar with 411 points in 1 hour 25 minutes. John Clark was well placed in second position with 410 points.

Only four females braved the conditions which resulted in a draw for the Eschmann and Todd families.
