'A' course to Watson

David Watson was fastest to finish the A course at last weekend's Saltbush Orienteers meeting at Wild Dog Hill.

David finished the 7.8 kilometre course in a quick 49 minutes, followed by Adrian Watson in 55 minutes and Alan Holland in 58 minutes.

Organisers were rewarded with an ideal sunny day for orienteering and there was a good turn out of about 120 participants who all enjoyed their day of bush walking or running and barbecue lunch.

Fastest male on the 6.1km B course was Robert Eadie in a time of 62 minutes. With a time of 94 minutes, Norma Young was the leading individual female.

Raylene Whittle's team and Bob Keil's team each took 90 minutes in this course. Several family groups tackled the challenge of this longer course and with time not important, their walks took about two hours.

The C course attracted 15 entries mainly comprising of groups. Kym Shearer teamed up with Scott Watson to take the honors. Their time was 50 minutes, closely followed by Debbie Drobjnak and Annette Brockhurst together in a good time of 54 minutes.

In third place and not far behind came Pat Shearer and Val Watson in 56 minutes.

The D course was well supported by 19 new competitors and juniors. Individual leaders were Nerissa Thompson in 24 minutes and Martin Hanley in 33 minutes.

Team leaders were Sophie Young and Imogen Mosley with 24 minutes. They were also the start and finish clerks for the event.

This was a long course for juniors and beginners at 2.3 kms.

The country used for the event was North of Whyalla conservation Park in the low hills and participants had a chance to see examples of the typical outcrop features of the area.

The next event is only two weeks away on May 13 and it will be held at Cooks North.

Signs will be on the side of the road indicating turn off to start area — just past Iron Baron turn-off on Kimba Road.

A special urn will be available for tea and coffee and a barbecue plate provided.
